Additional Comments:

Instead of increasing capacity, the GPO is committed to reducing demand through a strategy of removing subsidies that encourage waste and encouraging investment in increased efficiencies. A GPO government would commit the province to a peak load reduction of 50% by the year 2020. This would be achieved by:

- 1 providing \$16 billion in loan guarantees, grants and tax credits for conservation and demand management programs**
- 2 allow electricity rates to increase over three years to the point where they are no longer being subsidized by the tax payer**
- 3 provide \$150 million per year for low income households to convert from electric heating to lower cost natural gas**
- 4 double the maximum provincial energy-efficiency grant to \$10,000 to encourage retrofitting of existing housing stock**
- 5 create a 10 year, \$500 million grant program to encourage the creation of energy-efficient municipal building projects**
- 6 reform the Ontario building code to encourage greater energy efficiency in all new construction.**
